

Brief History

Amelia has been competing at Little A's since the age of 7 and made her first appearance at Zone back in 2016. Like most little A's athletes, she experimented with different events in both track and field. Initially Amelia gained some success in Discus and Shot by progressing to Region in 2017 and then qualifying for her first State Championships in Javelin in 2018. Then in 2019 and 2020 COVID cancelled Little A's State and this put a hold on her progress as an athlete.

Amelia then applied for the Westfields Athletics program and was successfully accepted for 2021. She attended her first NSW Junior Championships even though this was only weeks into her appearance at Westfields. Competing up an age group she contested the Long jump, Discus and Javelin. A very strong performance gave her a top 8 finish in Javelin with an impressive p.b. of 25.97.

By the end of the year, and more State-wide Covid interruptions, Amelia contested her first NSW All Schools in various events and once again was impressive in Javelin with a 5th placing. Then Amelia discovered two new events the Hammer throw and Pole vault. Within months she was contesting the 2022 NSW Junior Championships and won her first ever State medal taking Silver in the U14 Hammer throw. Ironically Amelia was favourite to also medal in the Pole Vault having confidently jumped over the National qualifying standard in training, however she no-heighted.

Amelia was selected in her first State team to represent NSW at the 2022 Australian Championships where she was brilliant in delivering 4 consecutive p.b. throws to take the National Bronze medal.

There were two surprises at the 2022 NSW All Schools when Amelia, who had earlier in the year won the National Bronze in Hammer, then despite throwing a massive p.b. of 40.12 metres finished 4th just out of the medals and did not gain selection in the 2022 Australian All Schools team. However, after several months training in Pole Vault she won the Gold medal in 2.20m which was the best ever first leap in competition by a female in WAC's history. She went onto the Australian All Schools to be held in Adelaide where she was magnificent in jumping a new p.b. of 2.35m to take the National Bronze. Interestingly, had she also qualified for the hammer, Amelia may have become the first ever female to win medals at National level in Pole Vault and Hammer – two events that normally don't complement each other.
